Our Kids Online 2025 Term 1 sessions

We want our school and our community to be a safe place for all children. Our tomariki are growing up in rapidly changing times, and the risk, frequency and severity of online harm are increasing. We need to tackle this as a community. As such, we have organised Filmmaker, Author and Speaker Rob Cope, Producer of the documentary "Our Kids Online" to present a humorous and eye-opening session to our parent community.

His talk will cover:

- Cyberbullying
- How bullies can reach our kids 24/7 Social media
- How social media is affecting the mental health in 3 out of 5 children.
- FOMO, depression, anxiety
- Gaming and the developing brain An oversupply of dopamine leading to dopamine deficiency, synaptic pruning, and the underdevelopment of social skills and empathy
- Naked Selfies The pressure to send nudes from intermediate up through high school
- Online predators The methods they use, how to spot them Online porn vs healthy sexuality How consuming online pornography as a child or teen can create a sexual template where violence, aggression, and dominance are seen as normal and consent can become very blurry.

Solutions:

- Filters Which filters are best and how to install them Smartphones -
- How to lock down a smartphone to make it a safe phone
- Boundaries How to put good boundaries in place around device use 3 golden rules -
- The 3 golden rules that will keep your kids safe
- Taking to your kids How to have difficult conversations with your kids
- Challenging our own phone and device usage -
- Reconnecting as a family.

The event will be held here at school on

Tuesday 11 March at 9am - 11am and again in the evening from 6:30pm - 8:30pm.

Light snacks will be available. Please note this talk is for adults only and is not suitable for children or teens to attend.

If you are a new to our school or have not already been along to one of these sessions, we csk that at least one representative from each family attends one of the sessions offered, and hope you are able to prioritise this within your busy lives.

Update from the FORS

We have some aspirational plans for our school to enhance the outdoor environment for our students. This is part of the school's Strategic Goal - enhancing the outdoor environment to reflect our school learner attributes. This year we are focusing ALL of our fundraising to these three initiatives:

- New junior playground incorporating a sandpit
- Development of the shade area on the back field into a 'play space' and
- Resurfacing of the pump track and extension to include a bike/scooter track

We will be seeking funding for these projects from community grants and other charities, but we do need to contribute \$30000 ourselves.

With this in mind the Friends of Riwaka School (FORS) have planned out the year to raise funds, in the hope we can achieve this lofty goal by the end of this year and get these projects completed!

Here is the outline for the year:

- Monthly Fundraisers:
 - April: Hot Cross Bun sales we receive \$1 per packet sold
 - 24 June: Matariki (proposed event is an evening celebration with hangi)
 - 27 July: Duck Race and mid-winter polar plunge (10 August postponement date)
 - September: Book Fair (funds raised from the Book Fair go back into books for the Library)
 - 14 October: Quiz Night at the Sprig & Fern
 - November: Student Council Disco
 - December: Christmas Hamper raffle
 - 15 February 2026: Riwaka School Harvest Festival
- Hot Lunches on Fridays (Hotdogs, Sausage Sizzle, etc.) We require a roster of parents for this.
- Bake Sale (One per team, per term) This will start in Term 2.

In order for this to be successful we need our community to pull together and support where they can. There will be a survey coming out soon for you to say when and what you can help us with. With our two BIG events - the Duck Race and new Riwaka School Harvest Festival - we hope to gain interest and attendance from further afield e.g. not families who attend our school. So we will start advertising these events well in advance to begin to hype interest.
