#### Reminder to Pool Key Holders

Thank you to everyone who uses our awesome school pool responsibly and abides by their pool user contract.

This is a reminder that pool keys are purchased to allow members of your own household only to access the pool. We understand there are times where your child may have a friend over or you have a visitor staying and they may come along for a swim with your family – but there have been instances where key holders are taking a big group of people with them or letting in people who do not have a key. This has been happening on a regular basis. The Pool User Contract clearly states the rules around this. Please be respectful of the other users and the cost of maintaining the pool which is directly impacted by the amount of people using it.

We encourage people to provide feedback on the options and on areas that concern them the most. The current Speed Management consultation is set to close on Thursday 29 February with the Joint Regional Transport Committee making its recommendation to Tasman District and Nelson City Councils in the following months.
