### Waka Festival @ Kaiteretere

This year between the 6th and 15th April the

National Te Hau Kōmaru Waka Hourua festival is being held at Kaiteretere. There will be 5 waka hourua anchored at Kaiteretere throughout this time, with Aotearoa's master navigators as crew. This is the first time the National Waka Hourua festival has come to Te Waipounamu and Te Tai o Awatea are tino harikoa to be coordinating the event.

During the week, mana whenua, tangata whenua and tamariki involved in kaupapa Māori are invited to weekday workshops. Due to limited spacing, workshops are offered to students in Year 7 and above; unfortunately, these dates coincide with our Year 7 and 8 camp. However, there are two public days planned on Sunday 7th and Saturday 13th April for whānau to come to. These days will have a toi Māori market as well as lightbox displays on the moana showing local pūrakau developed by our local Māori theatre company. We encourage our school community to support this amazing event by attending one or both of the public days.


